I. Recreational Sports Overview

Baseball & Softball

- Participation:
- 118 youth registered.
- Participants included 3 players from Ontario (softball) and 4 from Walworth (Majors).
- Highlights:
- Successful Opening Day.
- Majors played a game against Lyons; Minors preparing for a tournament.
- Challenges:
- Weather-related disruptions.
- Low parent volunteer turnout; communication sent to families requesting assistance with scorekeeping.
 - Field Improvements:
- Possible proposal in progress for clay/dirt renovation based on support from community businesses
 - Local businesses have offered to contribute materials/services.

Fall Baseball Planning

- Schedule:
- T-Ball (Mondays), Grasshoppers (Tuesdays) September 8 through October 7.
- Sign ups to be held first two weeks of August

Soccer

- Season Kickoff: Started smoothly 7/8.
- Field Setup Concerns:
- Inconsistent field sizes and uneven ground.
- Ideal long-term solution: install permanent field pins to preserve consistent layout and avoid uneven spots.
 - Parking Issues:
 - Parking on fields has potential to damaged fields, posing safety concern
 - Inadequate parking space noted; further discussion recommended.

II. Facilities & Infrastructure

- **Bleachers**: Repaired and repainted.
- Pests: No current signs of pest issues.

III. Budget Recommendations Discussed

- Port-A-Potties & Bathrooms:
- Budget line recommended to place port-a-potties earlier in the year or open lodge restrooms sooner.
 - Kitchen Pantry:
- Request for budget line to install doors on lodge pantry/cabinets (missing summer rec snacks).

- Parking Barriers:
- Suggest budget allocation for physical barriers to prevent vehicle traffic on grass/fields.
- Recreation Reserve Fund:
- Consider creating a reserve fund using a portion of program revenue for reinvestment that normally falls into a general reserve fund.
 - Matching Funds for Grants:
 - Portion of reserve funds could be earmarked for future grant matches.

IV. Long-Term Capital Improvement Ideas

- Parking Enhancements:
- Add a new lot behind the fields.
- Reconfigure front lot to maximize available space.
- Park Expansion:
- Explore opportunities to increase field sizes and park footprint.
- Field Regrading:
- Address uneven surfaces to improve safety and quality of play.
- Lodge Modifications:
- Develop rental space inside the lodge for community groups (e.g., Scouts, 4H) for lockable storage with customized doors featuring group logos/info.
 - Would serve as an operations hub for youth organizations.
 - Would require analysis of current lodge usage and available space.
 - Additional Structures:
 - Add dugouts to back fields.
 - Future planning consideration through a comprehensive planning process.
 - Multi-Purpose Courts:
 - Discussed if basketball courts could accommodate tennis/pickleball.

V. Recreation Director Role

- Job Description:
- Duties discussed and agreed upon with job description to be sent to the board for review
- Duties May Include:
- Scheduling and coordination of all programs.
- Volunteer communication and delegation.
- Team formation and equipment oversight.
- Day-to-day operational management.
- Conflict resolution and central point of contact.
- Pay Scale: discussed

VI. Community Engagement & Trail Programs

- Trail Collaboration:
- Considering development with Trail Works, Scouts, and local landowners.
- A "Hiking Challenge" development discussed, potentially tracked via a mobile Notes App (funding uncertain).
 - Trail Expansion:
 - Marion currently lacks official trails; efforts are underway to establish a starting point.
 - Geocaching:
 - Consider planning for a community Adventure Lab experience.
 - Sponsorship Opportunities:

Exploring partnerships with FL Trail Town and local wineries/breweries as hike endpoints.

VII. Follow-Up Items for Town Board

- AED Signage:
- Still missing from lodge exterior; a centralized outdoor AED is requested.
- Concern raised about travel soccer teams not having AED access.
- Field Safety:
- Further discussion needed regarding prevention of vehicles on playing fields due to injury risk and field damage
 - Restroom Signage:
 - Request for directional signage pointing to open restrooms.
 - Storage Locker:
 - Ongoing follow-up on previous discussions regarding locker availability and use.
